- Passenger Railroad: Amtrak


Road

- Black Warrior Parkway, a 6-mile, 4-lane western bypass connecting U.S. Highway 82 with I-20/59

The Black Warrior River

The Black Warrior River bisects Tuscaloosa County and is part of Alabama's network of more than 1,300 miles of navigable waterways (the largest inland waterway system in the U.S.)

Connects Tuscaloosa County to the Tennessee, Ohio and Mississippi Rivers via the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway

Connects Tuscaloosa County to the Port of Mobile
